Board Reports:

Megan Huber, President Report:

- Spirit Store brought in over \$12K and that is break even as well, we will not be buying any more inventory so throughout the 2nd half we believe the profit will increase.

Committee Reports:

- <u>Activities:</u> not present, will give an update closer to the winter dance in Late February, look for volunteer sign ups
- Community Outreach: Not present, no update at this time.
- CRC: not present. New sign up is out for CRC, todays event went really well, over 65 student attendees and these will occur weekly.
- <u>Fundraising Committee:</u> Welcomed Trish as the new Committee Lead. Considering some different ideas for engaging more people in activities; including more Parent involvement.
- GOAL Award: Melissa was not present; no update, expect an update as we get closer
 to the spring; applications typically come out in February. More information is on the
 Parent Cats page and available on the CRC.
- **Gym uniform:** We did a social media announcement to alert parents how to purchase gym uniforms for those enrolled in gym in 2nd semester, we also asked the office at LHS to help sell as well as students come in inquiring about gym uniforms.
- <u>Hospitality:</u> Fall Teacher and Staff Fine Arts Lunch was attended by over 200 people, Community did a great job donating treats, chips, water etc. Looking for treat days for the 2nd semester. With the new cafeteria structure the price of hot cocoa went from

\$300->\$2000 so we are reworking on pricing or exploring alternatives. Cookies have also doubled in price so we are looking to some new ideas.

- Social Media: Present, nothing new to report
- Spirit Store: 8th grade LHS Orientation is January 12th, New shirt for the class of 2027.
- Website: Updated the website with the new Fundraising Chair.

Principle Update

- Dr. K gave an update on student course registration, Senior Graduation Party, and ESSER (Elementary and Secondary School Emergency Relief) grants have provided federal pandemic relief funding) LHS is looking for ESSER Committee Volunteers who want to be on the committee to see how we want to use these funds to address Pandemic related learning loss
- Peer Tutoring or Student Teacher assistant, sign up is available for those who want to tutor others, if a student does three or more a week, they can earn course credit or get NHS hours (one or the other) A
- Also, students can ask Teachers to be Teachers Assistant. This is agreed to on a teacher-by-teacher basis. There is 2nd semester sign up and they can speak to their counselor about making time in their schedule to do this next year.
- Sunrise Rotary is doing a fundraiser on March 11th. They are brining in Second City as part of the event. Proceeds will go to community, District 128 and District 70.
- We also reviewed newly renovated spaces in LHS where we are trying to create more contemporary learning to meet the needs of the next generation.
- Questions
 - Q: Why final semester grades no have +/-?
 - A: Officially our grading system does not have +/-
 - o Q: Location of Graduation
 - A: Last year we surveyed the parents, and the parents were split 50/50, Senior Students voted more for Sears Center to have their who family attend and we have a two year contract. We will reevaluate for class of 2025.
 - Q: Workout weight rooms for teams, not fair as all don't have access
 - A: There are supervised and non-supervised time open for the gym please contact Mr Woods to understand the schedule and address any concerns about access. We are proud of our weight room and our partnership with IBJI.
 - Q: Military Recruiters, why don't we do more with that?
 - A: Our program is personalized because of the low percentage of people reporting interest in the Military. 5 Seniors/10 Juniors this year. We held military Mondays and held sessions with the branches of the military the same as we do with college and university representative. We also offer the ASFAB test for those interested in military service or academy program.
 - O Q: Can we offer Junior ROTC?
 - o A: We can but there hasn't been the interest to justify this
 - Q: How do we proactively prevent students from bringing guns to school?

- A: Research has shown low effectiveness of metal detectors. All students enter through a door supervised by a security guard. We are extremely responsive to concerns that arise and stay tuned to chatter. We work closely with the authorities on any concerns. We have an armed Libertyville Police Department in the building every day. We also have an anonymous reporting bot for student to tell us about any concerns.
- O Q: Do we have a drug dog?
- A: We do have a drug dog that visits the school at various times and spends most of his time in the parking lot but also goes through the school in a random fashion.

<u>Libertyville Connect Coalition</u> Village is looking at brining in a Cannabis dispensary if anyone wants to discuss that please see Rebecca Gaples.
