D70 has a lot of new faces in positions. Their meeting discussions focused a great deal on their safety and strategic plan. They are also starting a district newsletter that comes out monthly; the  $2^{nd}$  Friday of the month

#### **Amy Neff, Treasurer:**

Shared the updated budget which can be found at the Parent CATS website. Budget was built off of prior years. Budget was approved by board.

Notably we increased the budget for student treat days. The directory is estimated as a break even item for now since we don't have prior year experience. We are also estimating giving \$10k to the school for Dr K "wish list" to make school improvements. Spirit Store and Gym Uniforms is a conservative estimate and we will update throughout the year with actuals.

# **Committee Reports:**

- **Gym uniform:** 290 orders for Gym Uniform Sales from Sports 11. In total, with buy backs we will receive ~\$10k in profits. All numbers are still being finalized. Planning is underway for Spring Semester Gym Uniforms.
- CRC: All volunteer slots are filled. College Rep visits are in full swing. Planning for an increase spend on Decision Day and looking to see if we can afford pizza versus snacks as given in previous years. Requested increase to their budget to \$1,800 was approved.
- Hospitality: Breakfast for the staff the day after Open House was very well received.
  Next Event is Friday of Homecoming, Sept 30<sup>th</sup> for students from Lee's Donuts decorated in LHS Colors. Staff Lunch in late October / Early November so we will be soliciting donations through square site in early October. We are looking to keep hot cocoa day and increase treats days; all are being finalized. Finalizing budget requests for 2022.
- <u>Activities:</u> This committee oversee coat check for Homecoming and Spring Dances; we will leverage volunteers' site as we prepare for the Homecoming Dance. We need a total of 12 volunteers on October 2<sup>nd</sup>.
- <u>Social Media</u>: This committee manages Posts Facebook, Instagram and new Twitter site. Need three (3) days advanced notice to post something.
- <u>Community Outreach</u>: Window Painting is on Sunday, Sept 25<sup>th</sup>. We waived the \$25 fee again; Recommendation maybe to make the waiver optional next year. Total of 34 businesses have said yes and 10 potential more we are still waiting to hear from. We have 48 teams that want to paint windows. Need some local music to donate time during the window painting. We will also have a spirit store table at the event.
- **Spirit Store:** The Spirit Store is open every Friday from 10-2 and is open to parents. Did a massive order to over come supply chain challenges; we are seeing great sales at lunch, football games, and web store (few items). Web store needs to be better

marketed will do a social media post. Looking into see if we can get a flags made for LHS.

- <u>Website:</u> We will work with Kate to see if the website can be updated to make sure volunteer opportunities are easily accessible on the front page.
- **GOAL Award**: No new report.
- <u>Libertyville Connect Coalition</u>: 5/13 Snowflake event at Highland 5-9 PM, we need volunteers. It's a partnership between LCC, LHS, Condell, WHMW and is a true partnership.
