COVID-19 Statement

In March 2020, District 128 began remote learning for all students. In January, 2021, we offered a remote and hybrid option, and in March 2021, a full-time option was offered as well. Students could opt in or out of remote, hybrid, or full-time as needed. No final exams were given, and students received letter grades in both semesters, with consideration of students' individual needs. District 128 resumed in-person, full-time classes beginning with the 2021-22 school year.

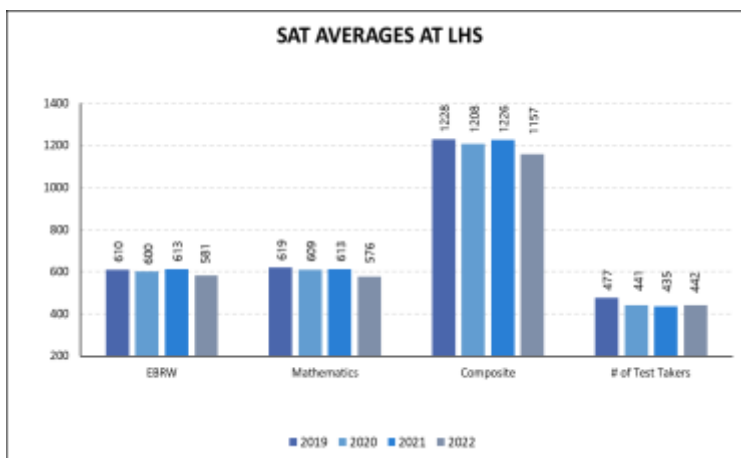
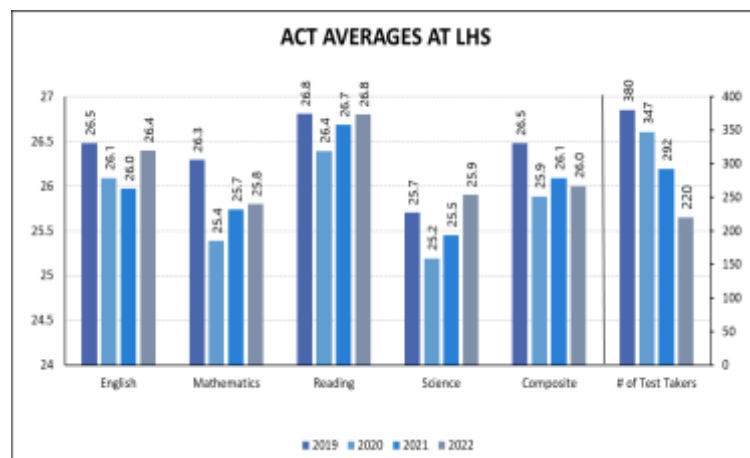
